- We are using a different Lord's Supper liturgy this evening to emphasize both the personal nature of the sacrament (by taking the elements individually) and the corporate nature (by singing together during the meal). The elders will hold the elements at the front of the sanctuary and we will proceed to them to partake individually. When partaking of the elements, please feel free to take your time.

- We invite you to come forward by the order of your row, starting with those seated on the piano side of the sanctuary. Once they have all gone forward, then the other side of the sanctuary will come forward by rows. Please proceed down the middle aisle towards the elders who are holding the elements. You are invited to pause to eat the bread and drink the cup, and then proceed back to your seat down the outside aisles. If you need physical assistance, please speak to one of the elders or deacons before the service.

- We understand that there are a variety of reasons that may prevent you from coming forward to partake. Please feel free to remain in your seat and to join us in song together.

- The Lord's Supper is open to everyone who has confessed their faith in Jesus Christ alone for salvation, provided that they have received Christian baptism, are members in good standing in a Bible believing church, and who are not living with secret or unrepentant sin. If you have any questions about these restrictions then please speak with a pastor or elder after the service, we would love to discuss them with you.
